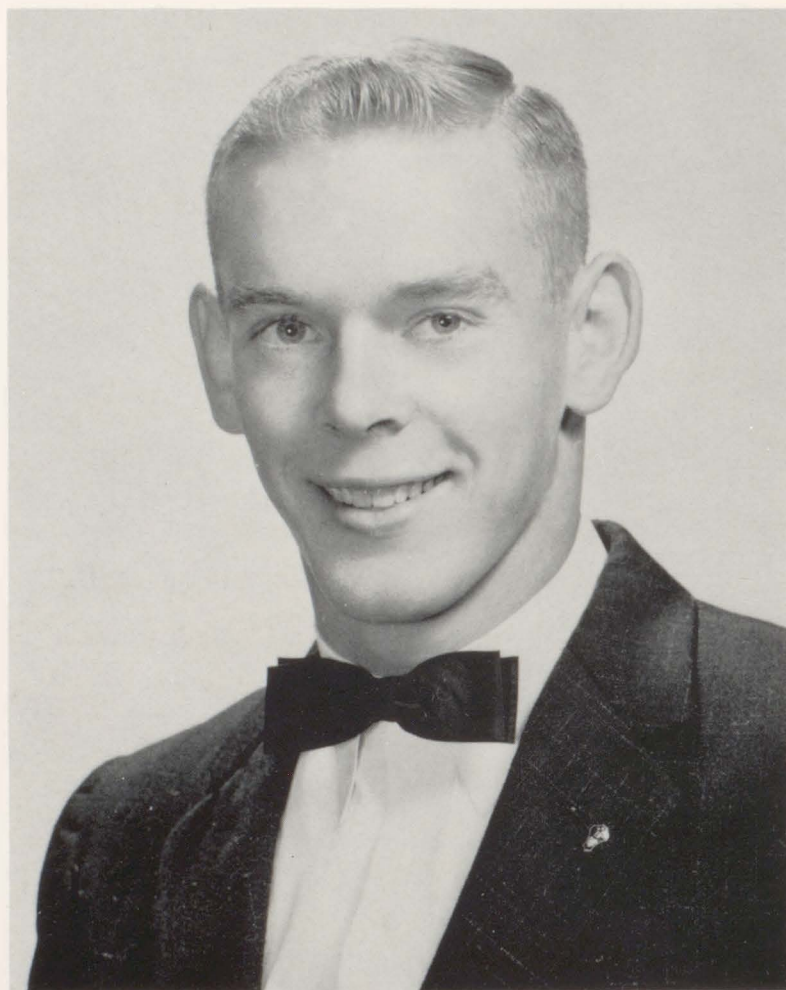
Principal's Message

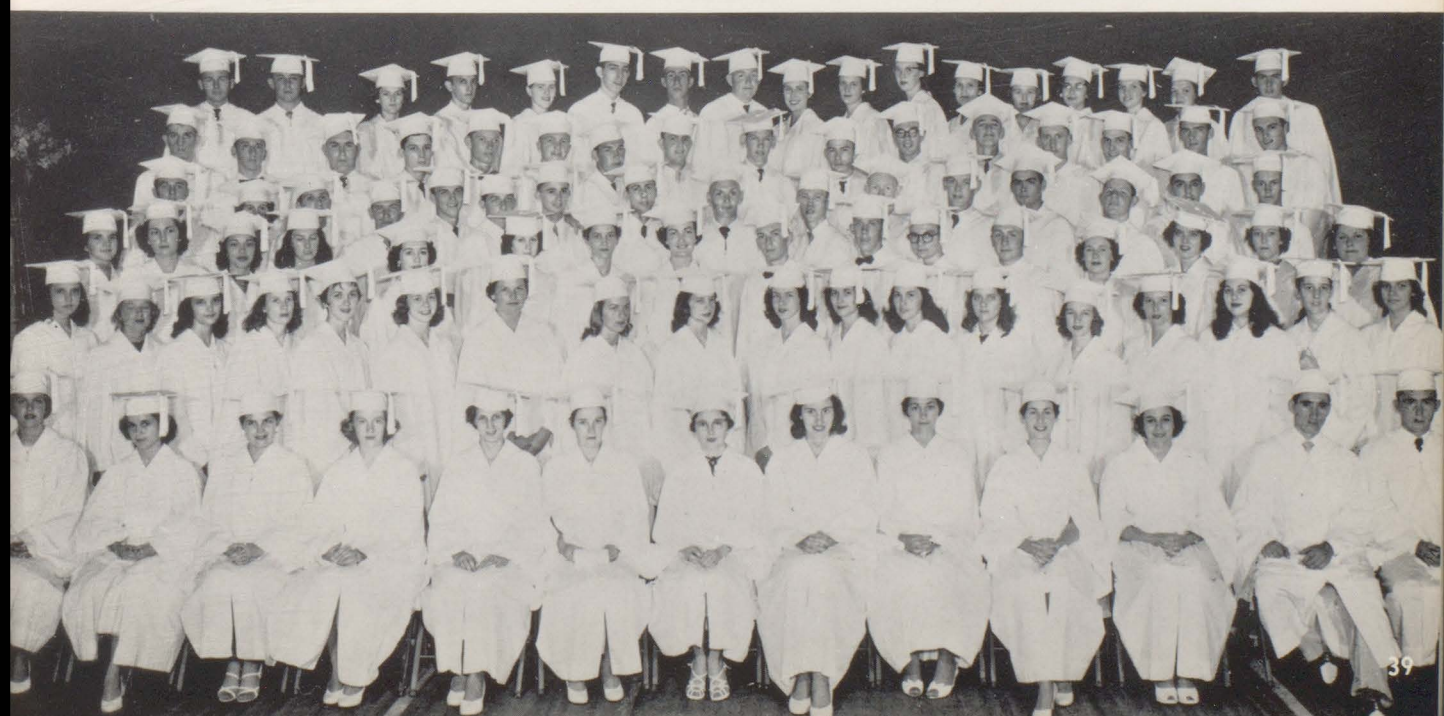
Graduation

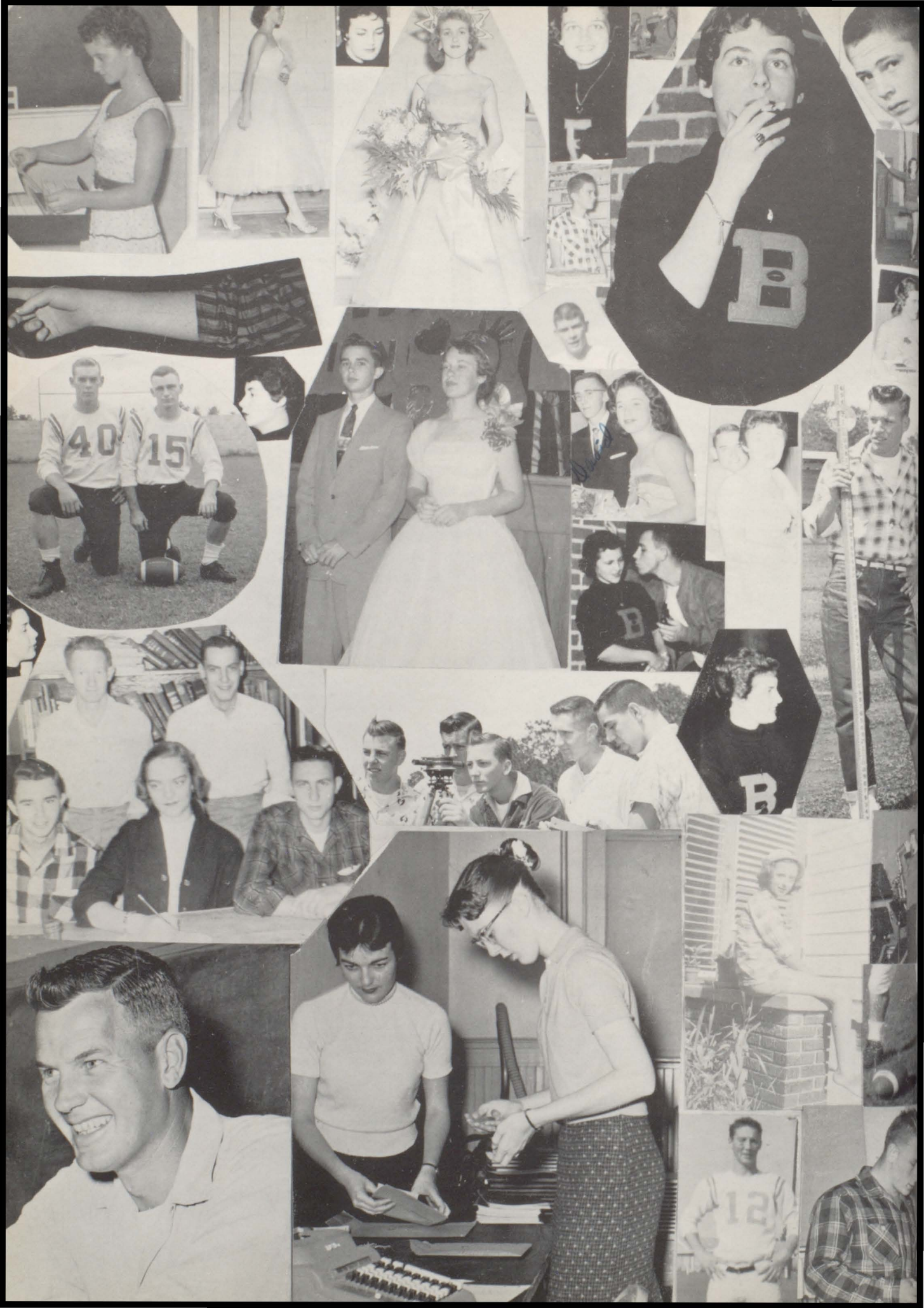
Sophomore Memories
